From the Rector

Dear Friends

"We can do all things through Christ who strengthens us." (Philippians 4:13) I have changed the italicized words to plural, because this beautiful statement of faith from the Apostle Paul seems just the right mantra for ECA this year. It recognizes that we are not alone striving toward God's will for us, but that our work and life together are an expression of living within the Spirit's guidance and help. We have seen a great deal of that around ECA!

At our Annual Meeting last Sunday, your Vestry communicated the idea of a new direction we are seeking for ECA. The direction is how to be church in a new way that will be healthy and sustainable for many years to come - that will continue to support and care for our members and to reach out, serving the needs of our neighbors.

The Vestry realizes that continuing to do everything just as we have in the past will lead eventually to the dying out of ECA. This is clear as we look at the challenges that face our congregation. But we also see great strengths and ample resources that convince us we have been blessed and gifted. God has already given us all we need in order to flourish as a church into the future. Our work is to notice, discern, pray, and plan. This requires creativity, enthusiasm, and faith. It requires all of us.

Last year at the Annual Meeting, we talked about the elephant in the room - the fear that ECA is dying... and the fear of change as well. Your Vestry watched the elephant all year and realized that the elephant fills the room so nothing else can get done. Therefore, this year, we would like the elephant to leave the building. We believe that the space/energy that is freed up when we let go of worry and fear about our future will produce the creativity, enthusiasm, and new vision we need to move ahead into that future

Your Vestry does not yet know what the ECA of the future looks like. We need the help of our entire, gifted congregation to manifest that vision. But we believe it involves maintaining our Sunday worship while discovering a "Monday through Saturday" ministry that will serve our neighbors and bring in financial partners to help sustain the entire church. That would open the possibility that the next Rector might work part time for this larger ministry and part time for the parish.

At our Annual Meeting on Jan 27th, we asked everyone to consider becoming involved in a focus group. These groups will look at everything and consider what we are doing now: what is creating energy, what activities or ministries might have run their course, who are our neighbors, what are their needs, what are the various possibilities for new ministry that will attract financial partners, who might those partners be? Please pray about whether you are called into this exciting work of discernment and planning. Your Vestry is eager to lead the way.

A t the Annual Meeting we thanked Rachael Parakh for her term on Vestry, and Bill La Vallee for his term on the Joint Venture Board.



The Vestry met on January 8, where the primary focus was discussion on how to structure the Annual Meeting, scheduled for January 27. Nominations for Vestry, JV Board and convention delegates are still being worked out.

Year-end financials were reviewed. We ended the year having received 98% of anticipated income and having spent 101% of planned expenses. Total deficit for the year is \$15,184. The Vestry also approved the draft 2019 budget, which will be presented at the annual meeting.

The next meeting will be the Vestry retreat, which will be held on February 1-2, with the Rev. Canon Jesus Reyes presiding.

- •Retirees traveling and visiting grandchildren
- •Busy working parishioners
- •Volunteer pool becoming smaller
- •Fewer parishioners, so pledges decreasing
- Facility maintenance costs are increasing
- •CCAV challenges will impact us
- •Grieving the physical loss of our friends moving away each year

On the Bright Side -- We can Handle the Elephant

- •Our love, relationships and finances are all healthy and stable as we plan our future!
- •Opportunity to become who God is calling us to be as a church and to let the Holy Spirit guide us!
- •While we are healthy, now is the time to create a 4-5 year transition plan to build a Church of the Future!
- •We are not alone; we have the Natiional Church and other external resources to help explore and plan our future.
- •We can focus on growing the NEW, not the Elephant!

Vestry's Direction
